#### Quarterly Report Pursuant to ARS 41-1604.07, Subsection P, Paragraph 2

The following information is submitted pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes § 41-1604.07. ARS § 41-1604.07 (P) mandates the department file an annual report regarding the recidivism rate of prisoners released on earned release credits (ERC) for a minimum of three years. Additionally, the department must also provide fiscal quarterly reports concerning numerous specifics of inmates. Data for this report reflect a static snapshot in time as of the last day of the given fiscal year and/or quarter; changes or corrections may be made to various records for some inmates upon review from staff in between the publication of previously released reports and current reports. This report includes information for quarter three of fiscal year 2024.
