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#### Annual and Quarterly Report Pursuant to ARS 41-1604.07, Subsection P

The following information is submitted pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute § 41-1604.07. ARS § 41-1604.07 (P) mandates the department file an annual report regarding the recidivism rate of prisoners released on earned release credits (ERC) for a minimum of three years. Additionally, the department must also provide fiscal quarterly reports concerning numerous specifics of inmates. This report includes annual and quarterly information for fiscal year 2023.
