

That is when inmates breached the control room, in the night. Inmates were coming out of the dorms to the perimeter, holding mattresses in front of them and then running back inside. Johnston is concerned the same inmates are going to be sent back, that is what people are saying and he is concerned the inmates will be the same, and it will start all over again.

#### CERBAT

Officer Jeremy Low – I went out early on shift, about 1750, assigned to Dorm 10. The whole yard was out, inmates in large groups. He was informed to be in constant motion by the sergeant because he was instructed to do "constant motion." When he heard Inmate [REDACTED] was out on the yard, he knew it would be a problem. The word was [REDACTED] stole stuff outside his race, possibly money, drugs and commissary. [REDACTED] was put in CDU due to altercations over this incident. Everybody knew what he did on the yard. No one was expecting [REDACTED] to be put back on the yard. He didn't write anything because the "higher ups" don't care. Everyone knew [REDACTED] was a problem between the races. Low told other officers. When his dorm emptied out, he got his case manager and they got off the yard. Low then assembled DART, when he saw the staff being beaten. He has the training and no one else was there. He checked cards for DART and he didn't want the officers to keep getting hurt. He made a decision and took the lead. He gave it over to Sgt. Panzer. This could have all been avoided, no one listens.

Sgt. Cartwright – told me Kemp was run off the Cerbat yard. Slightly vague details, but something to do with inmates finding out about a snitch, who Kemp apparently used to find contraband.
