Our EPCR team has led an initiative to implement the Ohio Risk Assessment System, designed to equip staff with the tools to meaningfully engage while addressing individual needs. Overall, this initiative aims to reduce recidivism and lower absconder rates.

The **Dress for Success program** promotes economic independence and prepares women for successful reintegration into the community by equipping them with skills and resources to be gainfully employed once released.

The **Power Paws program** provides job skills in dog training while fostering empathy, patience, and purpose, further supporting the women at Perryville with the skills to successfully reenter society.

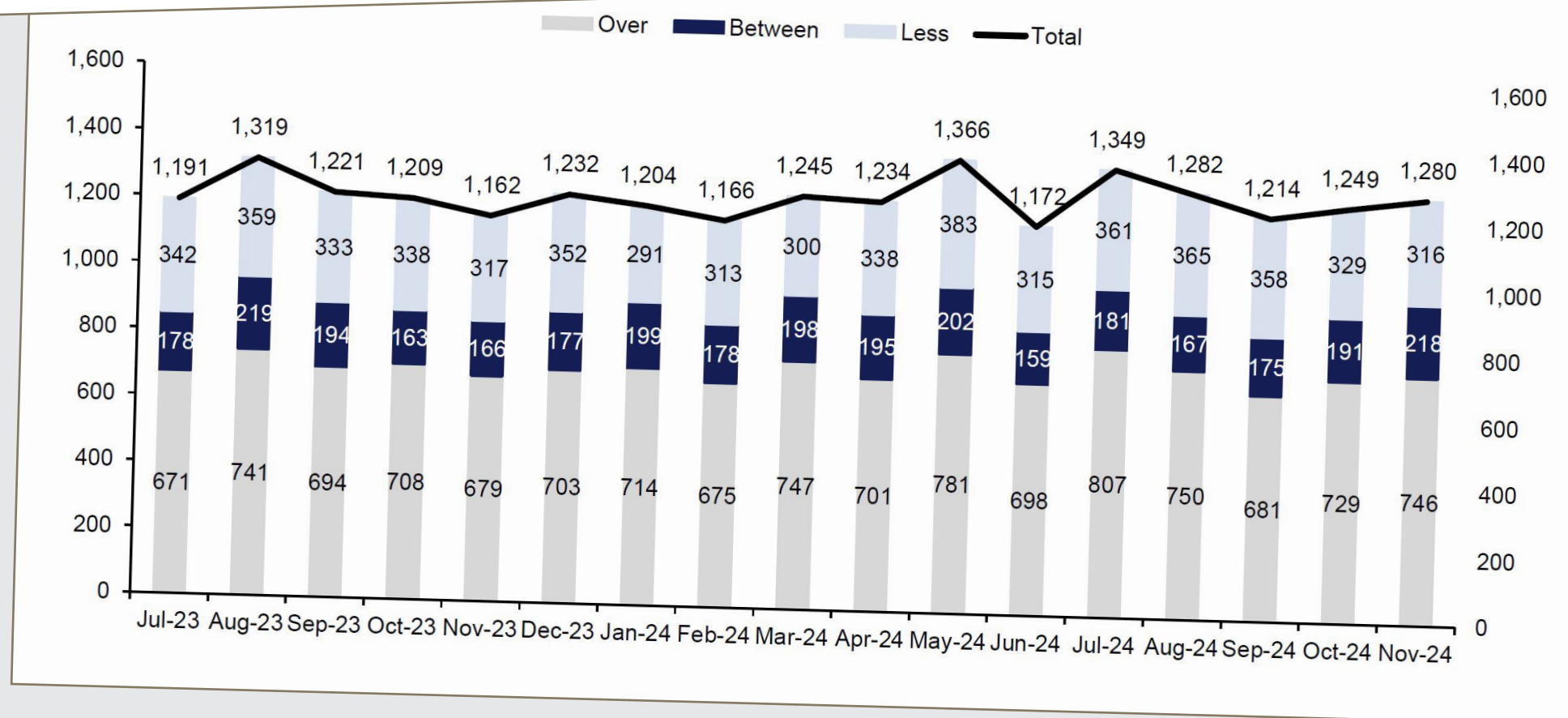
