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Quarterly Report Pursuant to ARS § 41-1604.07, Subsection P, Paragraph 2

The following information is submitted pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute § 41-1604.07. ARS § 41-1604.07 (P) mandates the department file an annual report regarding the recidivism rate of prison residents released on earned release credits (ERC) for a minimum of three years. Additionally, the department must also provide fiscal quarterly reports concerning numerous specifics of prison residents. Data for this report reflect a static snapshot in time as of the last day of the given fiscal year and/or quarter; changes or corrections may be made to various records for some residents upon review from staff in between the publication of previously released reports and current reports. This report includes information for quarter two of fiscal year 2025.
