# ADC named top donor to LETR



The Arizona Department of Corrections (ADC) has once again earned top honors for its generosity towards Special Olympics. For the third time in the past four years, ADC has been the top donating state agency to the Law Enforcement Torch Run (LETR) for Special Olympics Arizona.

In 2011, ADC staff participated in a number of fundraising events and raised \$127,062.58 for the LETR and Special Olympics Arizona. That is more than double the amount donated in 2010.

During the Annual LETR Coordinators Conference in October, Director Charles L. Ryan accepted a plaque for the department that recognized ADC as the highest fundraising agency in 2011. ADC also won the top agency fundraising award in 2008.

**In 2011, ADC raised \$127,062.58 for the LETR and Special Olympics Arizona, more than double the amount donated in 2010.**

Raising money for and awareness of Special Olympics is the mission of the Law Enforcement Torch Run, which sponsors several events across Arizona to help subsidize athletes with intellectual and physical disabilities. In three separate award ceremonies around the state, seven Arizona state prisons were also recognized for their contributions to Special Olympics Arizona, raising thousands of dollars through events like the Polar Plunge, Cop on Top, Fire Truck Pulls, staff donations, Tip A Cop, inmate food sales and participation in the Law Enforcement Torch Runs.


## ADC participates in the Arizona 2011 statewide exercise

The Arizona Department of Corrections' (ADC) participated in the Arizona 2011 Statewide Exercise on Nov. 3. The scenario for ADC's role was a storm that caused flooding damage to one of the prisons.

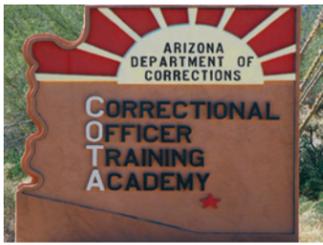
In response to simulated hazardous weather reports, Emergency Operations Center (EOC) staff at the Central Office was activated and engaged with state agencies and complexes to coordinate support and resources. Staff at ASPC-Perryville, in partnership with the AZ National Guard's 850th Military Police Battalion, simulated a prison

evacuation and executed ADC's responsibilities as cited in the Maricopa County Department of Emergency Management's White Tanks #3 Emergency Response Plan.

The exercise provided ADC the opportunity to validate internal Emergency Response Plans & Procedures while testing integration capabilities with other state agencies. It also provided Level II Incident Command experience and introduced participants to new technologies including WEBEOC, Communicator, and Google Docs for exercise control.

# COTA CORNER

The Arizona Department of Corrections congratulates the recent graduates of the Correctional Officer Training Academy. COTA is located on 40 acres in the foothills west of Tucson, with additional classes held at other locations at prisons around the state as necessary and twice a year COTA also hosts a K-9 Academy. COTA provides training for ADC cadets and tenured staff and for county jails and other detention centers around the state. The curriculum encompasses 360 contact hours and the graduating cadets receive 21 Community College credits, which they can then use towards higher-level education degrees. Cadets are trained and assessed in six different areas including academics, physical fitness, firearm qualification, self defense, professional behavior and ethical standards. Following nine weeks of training, graduates are sworn in as Correctional Officers.

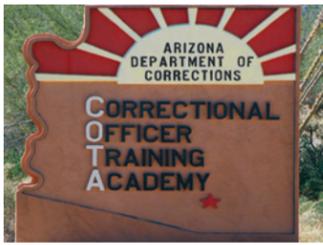

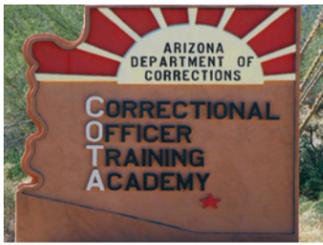

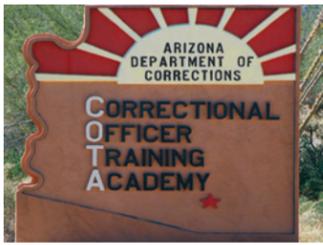
